


Your guide to Creating cosy Ear Warmers



Materials Needed:





- Crochet hook (size 10 mm if using chunky)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends





Abbreviations:

- Chain (ch)
- Slip stitch (sl st)
- Half Treble Crochet (HTC)
- Back Loop Only (BLO)

Foundation Chain:

Ch 57 (this is 55 for the length plus 2 for your turning chain).

Tip for Success:

This measurement is for a standard sized adult head! You can adjust accordingly)

Round1:

- Starting in the 3rd loop from the hook
- Half Treble Crochet into each stitch
- You should have 55 stitches at the end of the round

Round 2:

- Ch 2 (does not count as a stitch).
- HTC in the BLO of each dc across.
- Turn.

Round 3 – 7 (or until desired width:

- Ch 2.
- HTC in the BLO of each HTC across.
- Turn.

Creating the knot:

- With the right side facing you, fold your work in half (make sure it doesn't twist)
- Move one side along so
 that the left corner of one
 side is in the middle of the
 top row of the other side
- Fold the edges around each other so you have 4 sides meeting
- Sew together, ensuring it is tight and secure



To Finish:

- Sew in your ends
- Turn the ear warmer so that it is right side facing out
